## New Business

- 2. Phil Marasco, a High River Fish and Wildlife Officer, was our guest speaker and shared some great information about his experience in the Province and he answered a lot of questions from the audience. Highlights included:
  - There are 120 F&W officers in Alberta and they are hiring 30 more.
  - The recent transition to sheriffs has been generally okay and rural crime watch has been a tiny portion of their time, in spite of all the political hype.
  - When reporting a poacher, collect as much information as possible like license plates, person description, vehicle description, time of the event, phone use,etc.
  - You need a fishing licence to catch Prussian carp in Frank Lake, but you can catch and kill them with any normal fishing technique (bait, spear, bow, etc.).
  - F&W officers do a lot of surveillance. Even though you may never have been checked, they've probably watched you hunting/fishing and didn't see anything requiring a check or ticket.
- 3. April 22 is the Frank Lake Prussian carp fishing day. Some out in the morning or afternoon to eliminate some of these invasive species.
